Proposed Charter Reforms

- □ The Council is placing a Charter amendment on the March 2024 ballot that would:
 - Increase the size of the City Council from five members to seven
 - Six of the seven seats would be elected "by district"
 - The Mayor would continue to be elected at-large








Election Systems


- 1. "At Large"
- 2. "From District" or "Residence" Districts
 - Very rare; subject to CVRA challenge
- 3. "By District"

Statewide switched since 2002:

At least 275 school districts, 36 Community College Districts, 177 cities, 1 County, and 53 special districts.



Districting Process Overview

| Step | Description |
|--|---|
| Two Initial Hearings April 11 & May 9 | Held prior to release of draft maps. Education and to solicit input on the composition of districts. |
| First round of Workshops April 15 – May 27 | Held throughout the community prior to release of draft maps. Education and to solicit input on the composition of districts |
| Map Submission deadline June 29 | Deadline for public map submissions to ensure the map can be presented and discussed at the third public hearing |
| Release draft maps July 4 | Maps must be posted at least 7 days prior to 3 rd hearing. |
| Two hearings on draft maps July 11 & Sept 12 | Two meetings to discuss and revise the draft maps and to discuss the election sequence. |
| Second round of Workshops July – September (TBA) | Additional workshops held throughout the city to discuss the draft maps. |
| Map selection October 10 | Map adopted either before or after vote on charter change. Final map must be posted at least 7 days prior to adoption. |
| Charter Vote Citywide vote in March 2024 | Charter changes put to the voters in the statewide March primary. |
| First By-District Election November 2024 | First by-district Council elections held. April 11, 2023 |

Districting Rules and Goals

1. Federal Laws

Equal Population
Federal Voting Rights Act
No Racial Gerrymandering



2. California Criteria for Cities

- 1. Geographically contiguous
- 2. Undivided neighborhoods and "communities of interest"

(Socio-economic geographic areas that should be kept together)

- 3. Easily identifiable boundaries
- 4. Compact

(Do not bypass one group of people to get to a more distant group of people)

Prohibited:

"Shall not favor or discriminate against a political party."

3. Other Traditional Districting Principles

Respect voters' choices / continuity in office

Future population growth







Defining Neighborhoods

1st Question: What is your neighborhood?

2nd Question: What are its geographic boundaries?

Examples of physical features defining a neighborhood boundary:

- □ Natural neighborhood dividing lines, such as highway or major roads, rivers, canals and/or hills
- □ Areas around parks or schools
- Other neighborhood landmarks

In the absence of public testimony, planning records and other similar documents may provide definition.





Beyond Neighborhoods: Defining Communities of Interest

1st Question: What defines your community?

- □ Geographic Area, plus
- □ Shared issue or characteristic
 - □ Shared social or economic interest
 - Impacted by city policies
- □ Tell us "your community's story"


2nd Question: Would this community benefit from being "included within a single district for purposes of its effective and fair representation"?


• Or would it benefit more from having multiple representatives?


Definitions of Communities of Interest may <u>not</u> include relationships with political parties, incumbents, or political candidates.













Possible Neighborhoods / Communities















Public Mapping and Map Review Tools

- Different tools for different purposes
- Different tools for different levels of technical skill and interest
 - □ Simple "review draft maps" tool
 - □ Paper-based simple "Draw a draft map" tools
 - □ Powerful, data-rich "Draw a draft map" online tool








Simple Viewing Tool

Very similar to Google Maps:

- Zoom in and out, or enter an address to see which district it is in
- □ Choose which overlays you wish to add (if any)
- Maps will be posted here when available






Simple Map Drawing Tool

- □ For those without internet access or who prefer paper
- Total Population Counts only no demographic numbers






Dave's Redistricting App (DRA)

Draw Your Community of Interest or a Full District Map

- Also includes simple district-mapping tool
- Email a link to your map to the City





Comprehensive Outreach Plan

- □ Launch of dedicated districting website, <u>DrawIrvine.org</u>
- □ Robust translation and interpretation support
 - Written content will be provided in Arabic, Simplified Chinese, Traditional Chinese, Farsi, Japanese, Korean, Spanish and Vietnamese
 - Interpreters in all above languages will be available at all community meetings and Council hearings upon request 72 hours in advance.
- □ Animated explainer video to explain districting in simple terms
- One social media post per week through October, including set-up of two boosted posts
- □ Five press releases distributed to the City's media contacts
- □ Five flyers promoting City Council hearings
- □ Twelve in-person community forums at various locations throughout the City to educate the community on districting and gather public input
- □ Two virtual community forums to accommodate those unable to attend inperson. These forums will be simultaneously broadcasted in all threshold languages and archived so they will be available to view throughout the process
- □ Six pop-up events throughout the City to encourage community involvement
- □ Direct email & phone call outreach to community groups & organizations
