#### **Proposed Charter Reforms**

- □ The Council is placing a Charter amendment on the March 2024 ballot that would:
  - □ Increase the size of the City Council from five members to seven
  - Six of the seven seats would be elected "by district"
  - The Mayor would continue to be elected at-large





### **Districting Process Overview**

Step	Description
<b>Two Initial Hearings</b> April 11 & May 9	Held prior to release of draft maps. Education and to solicit input on the composition of districts.
<b>First round of Workshops</b> April 15 – May 27	Held throughout the community prior to release of draft maps. Education and to solicit input on the composition of districts
<b>Two hearings on draft maps</b> July 11 & Sept 12	Two meetings to discuss and revise the draft maps and to discuss the election sequence.
<b>Second round of Workshops</b> July – September (TBA)	Additional workshops held throughout the city to discuss the draft maps.
Second Map Submission deadline August 31	Deadline for public map submissions to ensure the map can be presented and discussed at the fourth public hearing
<b>Release draft maps</b> September 4	Maps must be posted at least 7 days prior to 3 <sup>rd</sup> hearing.
Map selection October 10	Map adopted either before or after vote on charter change. Final map must be posted at least 7 days prior to adoption.
<b>Charter Vote</b> Citywide vote in March 2024	Charter changes put to the voters in the statewide March primary.
<b>First By-District Election</b> November 2024	First by-district Council elections held.

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### **Districting Rules and Goals**

#### 1. Federal Laws

Equal Population Federal Voting Rights Act No Racial Gerrymandering



2. California Criteria for Cities

- Geographically contiguous
- 2. Undivided neighborhoods and "communities of interest"

(Socio-economic geographic areas that should be kept together)

- 3. Easily identifiable boundaries
- 4. Compact

(Do not bypass one group of people to get to a more distant group of people)

#### **Prohibited:**

"Shall not favor or discriminate against a political party."

## Draft Maps Overview

# □ We received 43 maps from the community – all are available for viewing on <u>https://drawirvine.org/draft-maps/</u>

- Five maps are single-district maps (114, 120, 130, 131, and 132)
- Five maps are not population-balanced (101, 102, 103, 110, and 111)
- One map has three two-member districts (118), and another is not reasonably compact (129)
- One member of the community submitted eight maps (118, 119, 123, 124, 127, 128, 134, 142)
- NDC added two maps to the conversation (144 and 145) based on testimony and feedback at workshops and hearings
- □ Council selected six focus maps:
  - **1**26, 133, 135, 136, 138, and 144
- Council also requested a revised version of 144 that incorporates the northern districts 1 and 2 of Map 109

■ NDC drew three new maps based on Council feedback: 146, 147, and 148

## Sequence of Elections

- □ The final map will need to have a sequence of elections indicating which districts will hold their first elections in 2024 and 2026
- □ The Council can designate any sequence they choose.
- Current Council terms are not affected; Councilmembers may serve out the full term they were elected.
- Because of the expansion, to have seven members on the new council, one district will first elect for a short term (two years) before holding another election for a full, four-year term
- □ In summary:
  - □ Three districts should hold their election in 2024 for a full (four-year) term
  - Two districts should hold their first election in 2026 for a full (four-year) term
  - One district should hold its first election in 2024 for a short (two-year) term, after which it will hold an election in 2026 for a full (four-year) term.
