#### Proposed Charter Reforms

- □ The Council is placing a Charter amendment on the March 2024 ballot that would:
  - Increase the size of the City Council from five members to seven
  - Six of the seven seats would be elected "by district"
  - The Mayor would continue to be elected at-large







### Districting Process Overview

Step	Description
<b>Two Initial Hearings</b> April 11 & May 9	Held prior to release of draft maps. Education and to solicit input on the composition of districts.
First round of Workshops April – May	Held throughout the community prior to release of draft maps.  Education and to solicit input on the composition of districts
Two hearings on draft maps July 11 & Sept 12	Two meetings to discuss and revise the draft maps and to discuss the election sequence.
<b>Second round of Workshops</b> July – September	Additional workshops held throughout the city to discuss the draft maps.
Final Map Submission deadline September 29	Deadline for public map submissions to ensure the map can be presented and discussed at the fourth public hearing
Release draft maps October 3	Maps must be posted at least 7 days prior to the hearing.
<b>Map selection</b> October 10	Map adopted before approval of ballot language for Charter change Final map must be posted at least 7 days prior to adoption.
Charter Vote Citywide vote in March 2024	Charter changes put to the voters in the statewide March primary.
First By-District Election November 2024	First by-district Council elections held.  September 12, 2023

#### 2. California Criteria for Cities

- . Geographically contiguous
- 2. Undivided neighborhoods and "communities of interest" (Socio-economic geographic areas that should be kept together)
- 3. Easily identifiable boundaries
- 4. Compact(Do not bypass one group of people to get to a more distant group of people)

#### **Prohibited:**

"Shall not favor or discriminate against a political party."

### Draft Maps Overview

- □ At Public Hearing 3, Council selected six focus maps: 126, 133, 135, 136, 138, and 144
  - The City reviewed a total of 45 maps, including 43 maps from the community
  - NDC added two maps (144 and 145) based on testimony and feedback
- □ Since the last Hearing, the City has received 16 new maps—all are available for viewing on <a href="https://drawirvine.org/draft-maps/">https://drawirvine.org/draft-maps/</a>
  - NDC drew three new maps based on City direction: 146, 147, and 148
  - The City received 13 new maps from the community, including 10 from a single individual






### Sequence of Elections


- □ The final map will need to have a sequence of elections indicating which districts will hold their first elections in 2024 and 2026
- □ The Council can designate any sequence they choose.
- □ Current Council terms are not affected; Councilmembers may serve out the full term they were elected.
- Because of the expansion, to have seven members on the new council, one district will first elect for a short term (two years) before holding another election for a full, four-year term
- □ In summary:
  - □ Three districts should hold their election in 2024 for a full (four-year) term
  - Two districts should hold their first election in 2026 for a full (four-year) term
  - One district should hold its first election in 2024 for a short (two-year) term, after which it will hold an election in 2026 for a full (four-year) term.
